Old business

 - Vice chair remains open position

New business

- Feedback on Early Report Letters Anne Marie; early reports after 5 wks of instruction. Messages were delivered via email. There were three comments students received (all good, good, need parent to come in). All grade 9 and 10 students and Grade 11 and 12 students having difficulties received a report. Senior students not having difficulties no requirement for teachers to provide Early Report Letters.
 - if two students in a home, can't tell what student report was for. Need more clarification on what "good" means? Does this mean not excellent? does student need more support?? In future - define the categories better.
 - Positive: like the electronic format! Vs. paper sent home
 - Maybe have a "no concerns at this time" or "good to schedule to a teacher/parent meeting" checkbox on the Early Report
 - More feedback: the emails didn't all come on the same day oddly scattered over several days (teachers were given a window to deliver feedback, so this was likely to be expected by the school, but perhaps not by the parents)

Fundscrip

- Was available last year, didn't work out well (raised ~\$10)
- People make an account, buy gift cards and a % goes back to the school
- The launch was in January last year. Better if launch in November or pre-christmas
- Suggest more advertising and electronic push. Will need to be reactivated (Jennifer to follow up)

Volunteer hours

 Electronic form for submission possible?? It is for the school board level to determine what BSS may be able to do. Action: Anne Marie will take to the board for discussion

School council - what do we want to see more of?

- Last year general tour. Anything more specific this year? Ex. last year showed SC "the POND" - a safe space in the school for groups to use
- Suggestions
 - media development/commercial for different programs that are electronically available to share with parents/public to learn about BSS
 - international students to give talks on their experiences. Also to discuss how BSS students could go on exchange somewhere else. Rotary club (Don is a member) has an international exchange program. 2025/26 international exchanges application period is RIGHT NOW. Rotary clubs need to have students selected by Nov 15. There are several training programs for students and parents that start in January. Could we have a talk on this/ info session? Also a graduation Bursary by Rotary club (\$1000) (would need to apply for this). In the spring there will be a session on all opportunities from Rotary and timelines. Short term Heather Stewart in student services can facilitate a connection if a student is interested right now. Also available online.

• PIC update (Jennifer)

- Looking for more members for the LGBTQ2S+ parent group
- Public health update vaping
 - Vape detectors on trial in one high school locally. Detectors also for overcrowding in washrooms (is a heat sensor) - the detectors only go off in an administrator's office
- Gr 9 Activ passes have been sent out
- Cell phone and vape posters have been made 4 key messages
- Looking for how the PIC can help disseminate messages
- More EA's needed scope and level of support that they offer and individual support plans.
 - HR crisis to KEEP staff, specifically EAs. hard to keep a roster of back-fills that are consistent for the students/staff needing the support
- Attendance campaign parents should add a notation when they can. The attendance secretary does monitor these comments and if needed initiates action to the family/student.

- Meet the Teacher night bell working well to keep timing at 5 min a session, but there are families that took more than their 5 minutes. Is there a way to give respect to the families that need more time but to keep the 5 minutes on schedule?
 - Suggestion: push the message that if parents need more than 5 min, book an off-line mtg with the teacher as opposed to coming to the parent night.
