Equity Team students who represent different facets of the school, they were invited to a pizza lunch and asked to participate. Students of varies races, religions, learning disabilities have been chosen to work together to make the school better. Students have opened up and were sharing challenges that they face on a daily bases. It will be student driven, they will decide if there are activities that they want to create or act on. Quite a bit of the feedback so far is to celebrate more. There are 11 students and 3 staff.

Salt of the Earth certificates will be handed out shortly. Teachers nominate students who quietly preservers, show admirable qualituies and may not always get recognized. These will be presented in classrooms or at the office, starting this week and going into the next.

Exam period, end of semesters have return to normal proceedings. There may be a summative or an exam. Some will be held in the cafeteria and proctored, some will be in classrooms, others may come in for an exit conference/interview one on one. A draft schedule is in place and will be finalized and posted shortly. We need to train ourselves to get back into the habit of what exam cycling is. Vacations are typically not a satisfactory reason to have an exam moved or changed.

Semester 2 has seen a hiring frenzy 25-30 teachers across the board, Bayridge will have 6 new fulltime staff. 212 additional students have been added to secondary schools (families who have moved here) and require more support.

The school has been slotted for a new roof and window replaces. Windows are original to the opening of the building in 1974.

The Grade 8-9 transition is starting in January. Bayridge will be going to feeder schools in January. John Swain is hosting an open house (also live streamed – will be posted on YouTube) for the computer specialist program on Dec 14th. This will also allow current grade 9's who attended online to participate also. Anyone can participate online.

School cafeteria will not be opened this school year, the catering company does not have enough staff. We have started slowly on Friday's hot lunch \$6. Toonie Tuesday pizza slices. Food sharing club makes sandwiches, salads, etc... for free. Pop up events occur often, students are notified the week of and are on the daily announcements. Looking to increase these services gradually.
